

# Flag Halyard

Flag Halyard from Århus Possementfabrik A/S was originally developed for Hans J. Wegner's Chair model 225, "The Flag Halyard Chair". The Flag Halyard Chairs seat, back og armsupports are braided in only three pieces of flag Halyard, with a total length of 240 meter, a process which sets the bar for quality and strength very high.

Århus Possementfabrik A/S has been in close cooperation with the producer of the Flag Halyardchair to develop and produce a product especially for the braiding of furniture.

Flag Halyard is in, most cases, produced of flax yarn, braided around a core of high strength filling material. This composition makes the flag Flag Halyard very strong and unable to stretch, even on a long distance.

Today, Flag Halyard from Århus Possementfabrik is used on a wide range of classical danish design furniture by Hans J. Wegner, Poul Kjærholm and Jørgen Høvelskov

Flag Halyard from Århus Possementfabrik A/S has a unique composition which makes it very suitable for the braiding of furniture. To accomplish these special abilities, the flag line is composed form three parts.

## The core:

The heart of the Flag Halyard is the core of f High tenacity polyester. This special type of polyester makes the flag line unable to stretch, and the 20 thick threads gives the flag line its high strength and ability to carry more than 250 kg.

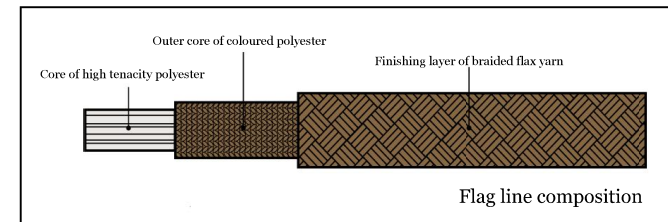
## Outer core:

Around the core, is a layer of coloured polyester. This keeps the white core from shining through the outerlayer, even when the flag line is bend around sharp corners.

## Finishing layer:

Around the core and outer core,The finishing layer of high quality flax yarn is braided.

The flax yarn is braided as a structure braid. This gives the Flag Halyard its wellknown look.

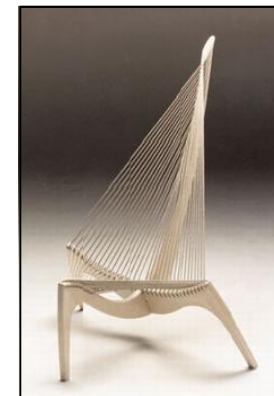


Flax yarn is available as standard in the colours nature and black.

Flag Halyard can also be produced with a finishing layer of Århus Possementfabrik A/S standard polyester in our full colour range of ca. 100 colours.
